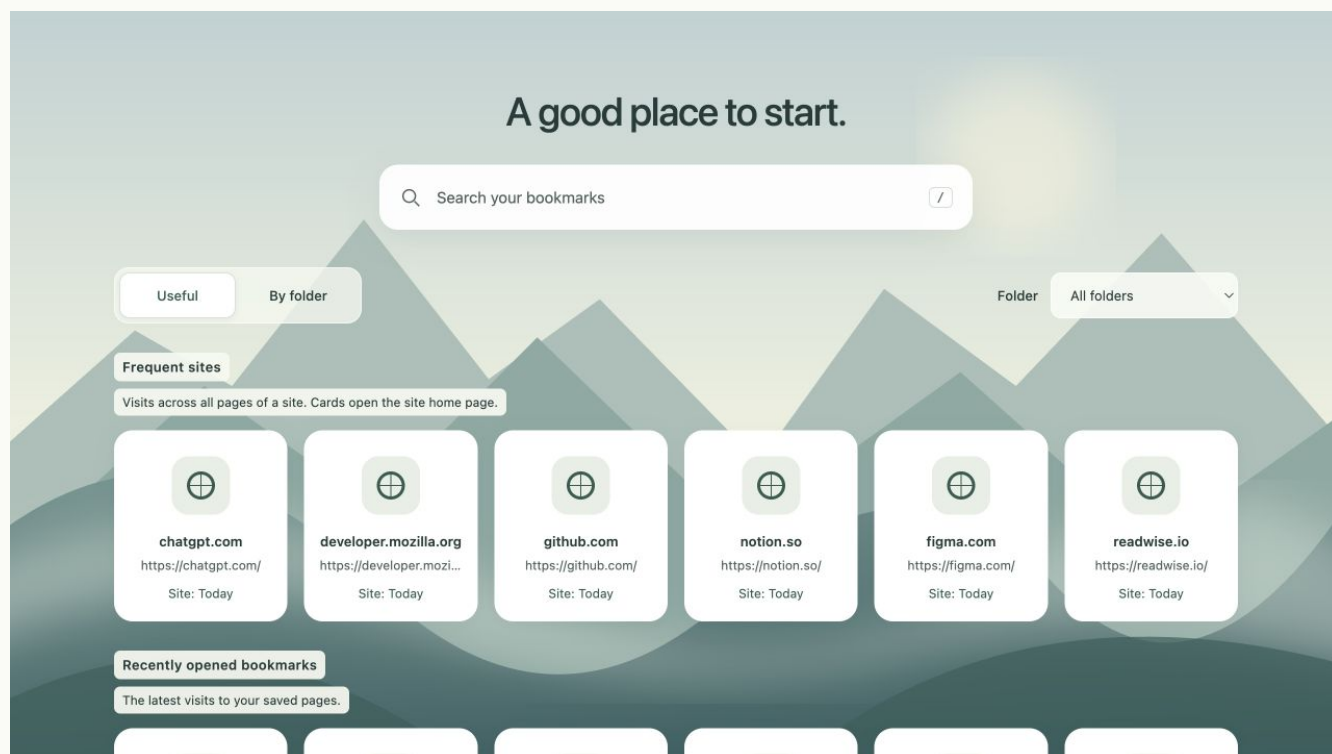


YOUR FIRST NEW TAB

Welcome to your grove.

Bookmark Grove interface with example bookmarks, not private browsing data.



Search at the top. Your saved links below.

Your own Chrome bookmarks will replace these examples. Use the folder filter to narrow the view, then type a word from the title or web address.

Optional history access

Choose Enable history sorting in the extension to use local visit data. You can keep using bookmarks and search without granting that permission.

GET STARTED

Your next tab starts here.

Install the free beta in desktop Google Chrome. No account required.

01 Unzip your download

Extract bookmark-grove-1.5.3.zip. Inside are this guide and the bookmark-grove folder. Move the entire bookmark-grove folder somewhere permanent, such as Documents. Do not delete it after installation.

02 Open Chrome extensions

Type `chrome://extensions` into the Chrome address bar and press Enter. Turn on Developer mode in the upper-right corner.

03 Load the extension

Click Load unpacked. Select the bookmark-grove folder, the one containing manifest.json. Select the folder itself, not this PDF or the ZIP file.

04 Open a new tab

Bookmark Grove replaces your new tab page. If Chrome asks you to confirm the change, keep it. Your existing bookmarks should appear automatically.

Need help?

If Chrome says the manifest is missing, choose the inner bookmark-grove folder. If another new-tab extension takes over, disable that extension and try again.

Updating? Replace the installed files and click the reload icon on Bookmark Grove in `chrome://extensions`. Cmd+R only refreshes the tab.

A few useful things.

Your bookmarks remain managed by Chrome.

01 Find something you saved

Search by bookmark title or URL. Use folder filters to narrow the view. All bookmark roots are included, not only the bookmarks bar. Add and edit bookmarks with Chrome as usual.

02 Choose history-based sorting

Frequent site cards open the site home page. Recently opened bookmarks open the exact saved page. History access is optional. A local cache is shared by your tabs; bookmarks and visits update in the background without a loading screen.

03 Your language, automatically

The extension follows the Chrome interface language: English, Ukrainian, Russian, Spanish, German or Brazilian Portuguese. Other languages fall back to English.

04 Update the manual beta

Download the newer package. Replace the files inside your existing bookmark-grove folder, then click Reload on the extension at `chrome://extensions`. Manual beta packages do not update automatically.

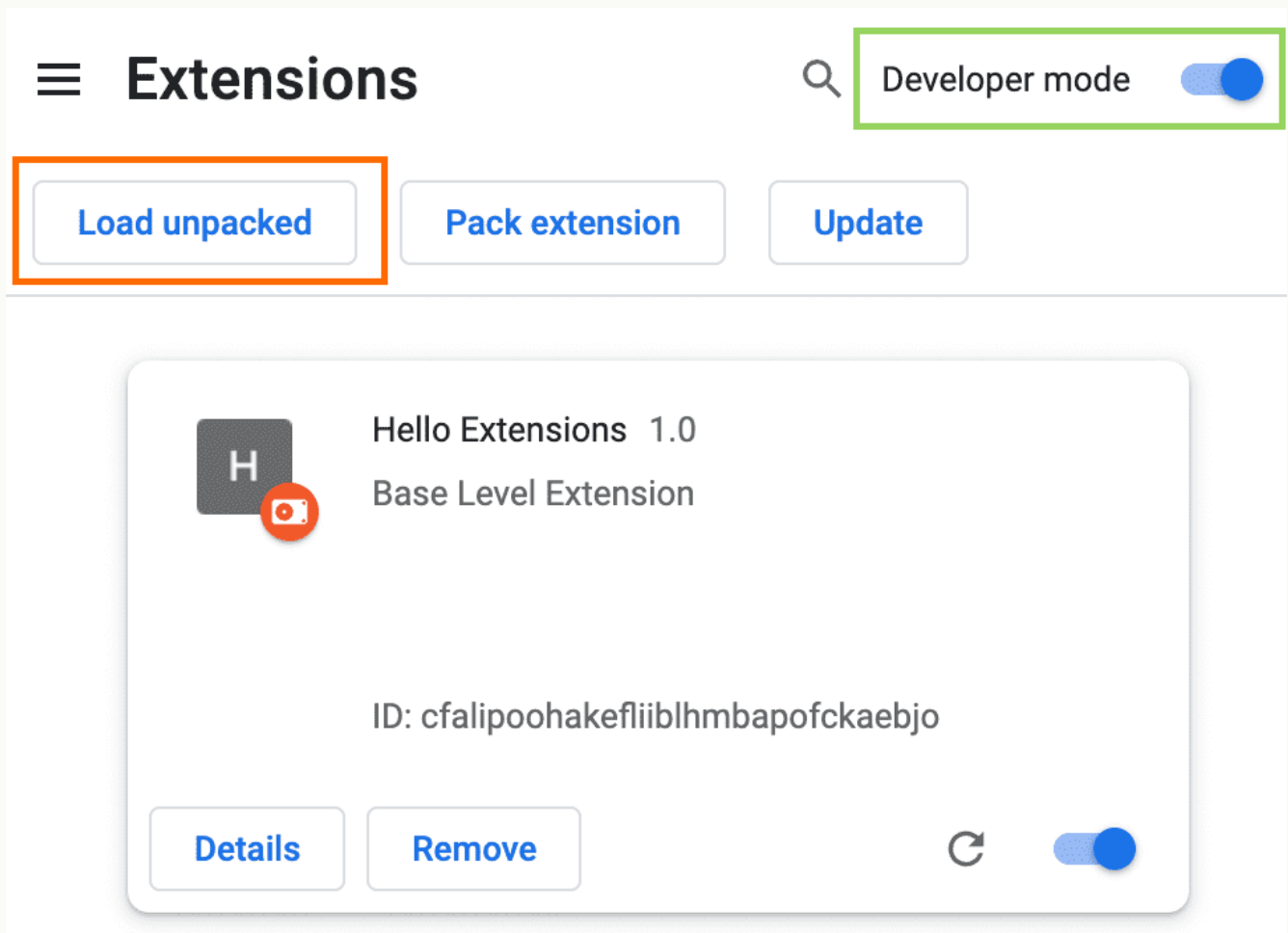
05 Remove it whenever you like

At `chrome://extensions`, find Bookmark Grove and click Remove. Your Chrome bookmarks are not deleted. You can also turn the extension off temporarily with its toggle.
